### The Albany Summer Internship Program

#### Albany internship (3 credits)

- Interns work at their placements 4 days a week for 6 weeks.

#### Internship placement & support

- Placements vary according to students' interests. Interns meet regularly with the ASIP Director for guidance, lectures, and networking events.

#### Optional online Marist course

- Online courses are available at a discounted rate in a variety of disciplines.

### ASIP Housing & Student Life

#### University Heights townhouses

- Students live in fully furnished 4-bedroom apartments that are centrally located in Albany's academic quadrangle.

#### Tuition

- The total program costs are \$3,100. This includes tuition, a program fee, and housing at University Heights.
